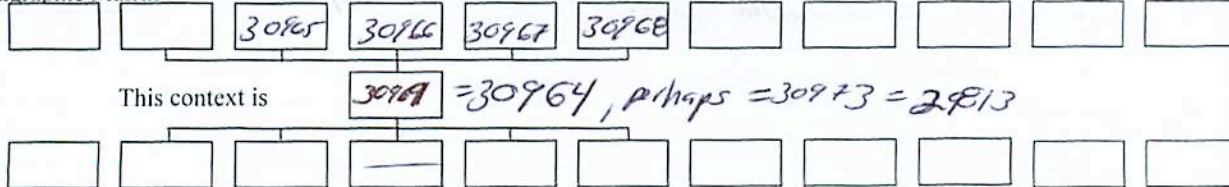

*gravels over earlier mud brick walls on the second terrace of basin. This is likely the same as 30964, and the mud brick walls were built on them. These two contexts are also likely the same material that the stone wall (30972) was built into, and the basin itself (30958) - This may be the foundation that was simply covered with some marker in sections. Where [30028] bisects, it's clear that this material is the same as that in the wall core of 30972. So much so, that they were likely the same context and just shaped by the builders.*

*another brick appeared ~~200~~ in 101-R 22 suggesting that this area had been covered by a wall too, perhaps that's what 30970 is remnant of.*
