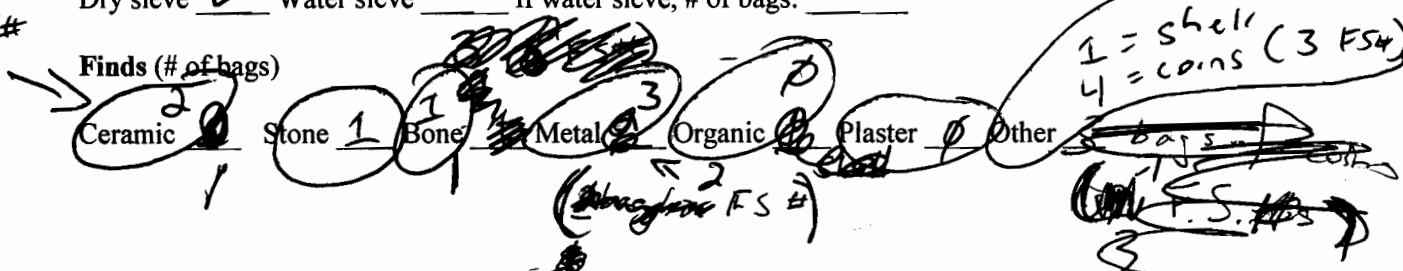

Description: Pattery rim + handle piece given

~~FS#~~ FS# 5013-1001. Less compact soil easier to move. More charcoal found nearest to the wall. Very ashy soil found and is now the bottom of SU 5013.

We found ~~2~~² coins at one location and gave them FS# 5013-1003. + FS 5013-1004.

Another piece of worked metal was found and labeled FS# 5013-1002.

~~Charred~~ Charred wood was also found in this layer along with small charcoal fragments.

An odd rock type began showing in the scarp wall near the location of the 3 coins.

Very variable consistency and color, possibly a metallic one of some kind as it is found ~~in~~ in this SU with much worked metal.

Bone found in layer. Many metal fragments and long worked metal found in ~~the~~ SU. The black ash that begins the next SU is a very clear ~~change~~ change from the compact soil of SU 5013.

Bone flakes found primarily in close proximity to the iron rod. Coin found on eastern end near the south wall.

It is probable that we are nearing the floor level. The east side of the wall feature (e.g. this S.U.) is now being identified as a possible interior space.

There is a large rock in the floor of the S.U. nearer to the west end (bounded by the wall feature) than the east which may be bedrock.

Another coin was found in the screen.

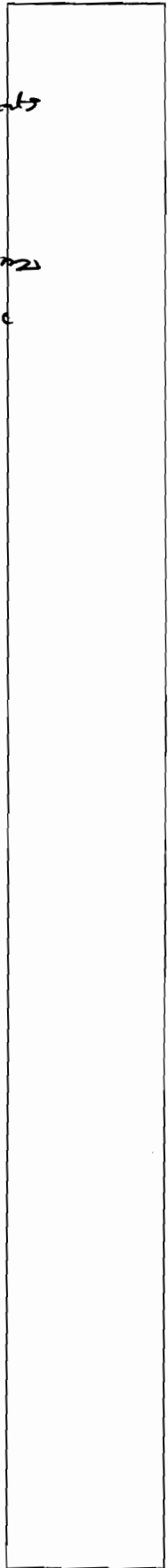

Description: The ash layer does not appear to be entirely consistent throughout. The large ash pockets ^{taken together with the charred wood fragments} may represent a large piece of structural material. The ash was noted as being 10YR 5/2 sandy clay loam. Toward the bottom of our S.U. we encountered more Hellenistic black-glaze pottery and some greenish sherds.
