Description:

SU 5107 opened when mudbrick pockets (SU 5106 + 5105) decreased and sediment became less compacted. SU 5107 represents an occupation level immediately above a floor surface. The unit was ≈ 11 cm thick and yielded larger pieces of pottery. The unit also included a fair amount of wall tumble, which in some instances lay directly on top of irregularly spaced gypsum flooring and pottery. Three gypsum flooring slabs were uncovered ^(in situ) in the SW corner of the trench [which were laid horizontal against the wall], flooring fragments scattered throughout the trench, and a fairly homogeneous hard compacted earth floor w/ small pebbles. The unit was closed.

Important ceramic finds included a black glazed Attic lamp spout w/ signs of use and about 50% of the flat folded spout variety.
