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As suspected after digging SU 5702,

Description: A wall was found about 8cm

down. It consists of rocks that are
moderate in size. In the area around
the wall, the artifact density
was very low. It runs east-west.
There wasn't any mudbrick found
above the wall. It seems to
indicate that it was used to
function in a settlement. Some
of the rocks are slightly loose.
While excavating around the
rocks, the soil was about 50%
stone. Towards the Western
side, the wall's width increases
a little. The West side is around
75cm and the Eastern side
is 58cm. Stone size was ~ 20cm
No mortar was found.
