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Description: In SU 5707 the artifact density increased significantly and immediately. The soil was very rocky and there was a lot of rubble from the Northern wall (feature 5702-f1). About 15cm down mudbrick was found. We switched to a finer screen to sieve in anticipation of finding the floor surface. A one handle jug closed vessel was found. We labeled it FS 5707-1001. It's estimated there could be at least 50% reconstruction possible. Some of the pieces in the ceramics bag could be extra pieces for the FS 5707-1001, but we added it to the regular ceramics bag to be on the safe side. More of the North part of the Northern wall ^(5702-f1) was exposed, which showed more layers of rock. After lifting the ceramic piece (FS 5707-1001) we closed the SU.
