Description: A reddish tint in the north-east

corner seems to be a pocket and we were unable to define the soil difference clearly enough to create a separate SU. The ceramic density drops significantly in this SU and no changes other than the color occurs. FS 5708-1001 was found in the North-west corner of the trench \approx 5cm south of the north wall and touching a possible wall running North-South on the west edge of the trench. The area where fs 5708-1001 was found is near or in the different color

In that corner. The vessel is a small-open vessel. At the bottom of this SU we are finding an increase in the amount of mudbrick so we have

decided to close the SU. We are also finding a considerable amount of shell, more so than at an other level. Since the two large stones at the southeast portion of the trench were floaters, we decided to remove them when starting the next SU (5714). When the eastern most stone was removed we found that the stone didn't rest on the floor and there was a circular grinding stone when it. We gave the grinding stone an FS # (5708-1002) and put it on the planview.
