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Description: South of Feature 5702 - F2. Pulled out the block that looked like cut stone. It appears to be the rim of a stone basin. It is difficult to tell if it was a secondary use in the construction of the Feature 5702 - F2, but without other pieces that appear to be the best interpretation. It was floating though. We are finding a lot of mud brick in between the two features, supporting the theory of a wall with collapse. Finding a lot of rocks within the features as well. Finding a lot of pottery handles, most seem to be for amphoras. We have begun to remove rocks from the features that are floating and look like tumble. For the SU below this the removal of the northern feature will mean the Northern will be moved further south. The northern feature is now looking more wall like with partial tumble, which has been removed.
