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Description: Same type of soil as SU above. We hit bedrock. SU 5709 and 5712 were a cultural fill after the construction of the North wall. Lots of pottery, found some bone. Also uncovered a part of a bowl (FS 5712-1001) similar to FS 5708-1001. We decided to close the SU because of the bedrock. There's no reason to believe the cultural material removed from SU 5709 and 5712 isn't contemporary with the North wall. We found a foundation trench, it is SU 5713.
