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Description: SU 7008 is the debris context beneath SU 7007. <sup>[from 7007-7008]</sup> Take changed SUs because there was a distinction between brown mixed-up debris (like that excavated within SU 7007) and a strip on the <sup>North - East</sup> ~~west~~ <sup>the area</sup> 0.26 cm of excavated under SU 7007.

\* What has been described as ash here is in fact a very degraded plaster and fine sand.

The brown matrix has some ash\* - really fine grey/white ~ and some lighter brown (to very fine sand with large stones, some cut but degraded limestone, and mortar chunks. This context (SU) revealed about appears to be a fallen wall line that extends from large stone in SE of excavated area to the northwest. Some plaster adheres to southern face of this fall.

Fall is oriented ~~SW to~~ <sup>from SE to NW</sup>

The wall is ~~in~~ or from its fallen position ~~it~~ it appears to be uncoursed (Random).

with a rough face that was originally plastered over.

It measures 180 cm from fall extend NW-SE.

The wall fall likely fell off of (i.e. belongs to) the corner of wall 7011-01 and perhaps an adjoining

we excavated fallen stones with su 7013.

It fell on top of debris excavated within ~~su 7012~~ <sup>su 7010</sup> and 7015.

The underside of the 2 large stones in the centre of the fall ~~was~~ <sup>2 faces of</sup> also plastered; when we removed these stones plaster remained in situ.

This extended approx. 70 cm from ~~SE~~ <sup>from SE to NW</sup> and had a depth of 10 cm. ~~Between~~ <sup>was</sup> stones reused floor(?) plaster with many small pebbles including ~~was~~ used between stones.
