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SU: 7012

Description: SU 7012 contains architectural debris (brown w) <sup>in</sup> lens of ash (seemingly but appears not to be from burning but from decomposing lime/gypsum). The SU comes from the southern area of the ~~the~~ western section of the trench - south of fallen wall 7008-11 (which is excavated in SU 7013).

This debris appears to go beneath the <sup>fallen</sup> wall 7008 - <sup>bl</sup> we could plainly see this <sup>in</sup> excavation - therefore we excavated the ~~the~~ wall fall and this debris context out of sequence.

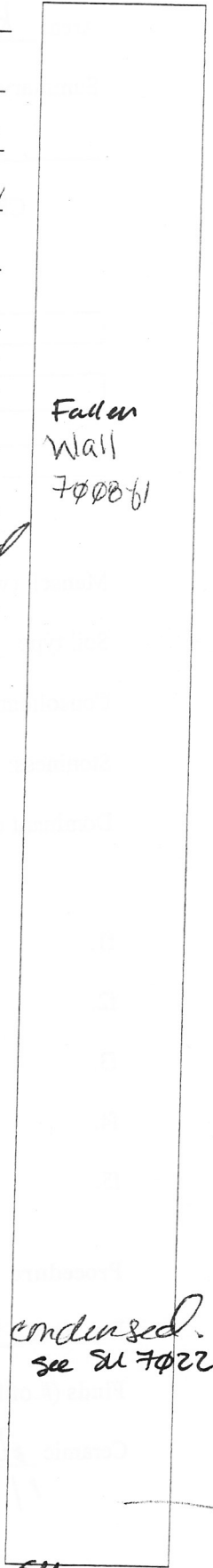
This SU <sup>also</sup> revealed the lines of a slightly SW-NE wall that appears to be <sup>the</sup> southern wall of a room - wall 7011-11 is the eastern wall with <sup>western</sup> plaster face of this same room - The ~~the~~ SE corner is not well defined and appears to have been partially destroyed - the wall fall 7008-11 is likely upper courses of this corner.

The debris is distinctly different ~~to~~ north of the faint wall line near top of it.

Soil to north is silty/grey + fine + soil on top of wall is more
