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SU: 7019

Description: SU 7019 consists of an ~~ash~~ (powdery) in terms of consistency and material and there was a bit of burnt pottery (recovered) that is dark brown/grey in color and soft/fine in texture. It was likely a part of the very fine brown material that we excavated as ~~part~~ in SU 7017 in terms of deposition - there was not a distinct cut ~~line~~ but 7019 did pull away from harder architectural debris beneath (= to 7015) like the material in SU 7017.

There are ^{very} few artifacts recovered w/in SU 7019 and some small stones, ^{tile} and plaster. The SU is located ⁱⁿ the north-western section of our trench and extends into western scarp. Appears to be perhaps in part disturbed architectural fall debris ~~is~~ likely associated with robbing activities (?).
