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Description: See 7025 contains/encompasses  
a very compact fall of mortared stone  
and tile in the center of the corridor  
space between walls 7011-f1 and 7011-f2.  
Tile <sup>west</sup> ~~east~~ of secondary door jamb installation  
7026-f1. It likely fell from the top of this  
door jamb/installation. It is slightly dislodged  
off alignment (i.e. it does not form a line with  
doorjamb and therefore was not blocking  
door perpendicular to walls 7011-f1 and 7011-f2.

It seems to be sitting above  
earlier fallen architectural debris. (7033)

When the ~~stone~~ mortared stone was  
fully articulated it became apparent that  
the block contained a large masonry stone  
with smaller stones used within thick  
mortar shell. When ~~excavated~~ removed  
we can see that the block was likely sitting  
upside down on the fill (7033) - its bottom  
contained thick mortar around smaller stones  
and the top of the stone revealed a well  
kept masonry.
