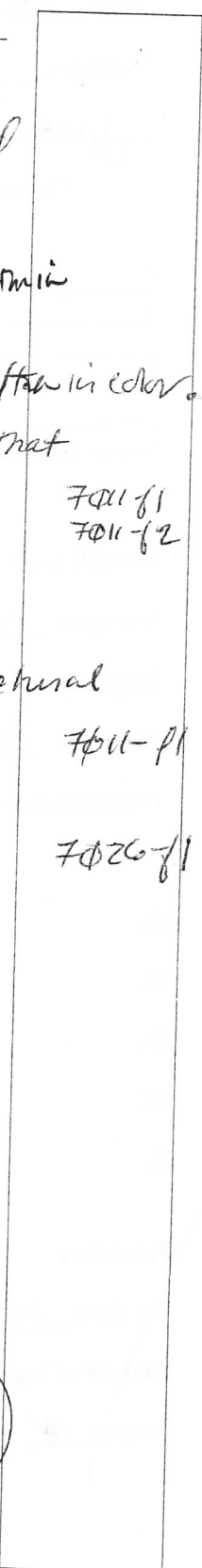

Description: SU 7027 contains architectural fall beneath SU 7023 which basically included material/soil from within and around the stones and tile and mortar <sup>chunks</sup> excavated in SU 7027. We changed see ~~because we are~~ <sup>because we are</sup> control - especially so close to surface <sup>exposed to the north in presence</sup> of excavations. Soil is very soft, loose, light brown <sup>tan</sup> in color.

This SU is architectural fall that post dates walls and <sup>tile</sup> the fall of architectural material excavated in SU 7025. It is distinct from more granular fill layers that we have found such as architectural fall block (7025) and wall 7011-f1, which was excavated in SU 7029, and <sup>that</sup> also north of door jamb 7026-f1, which was excavated in SU 7030.

It is also slightly different from that excavated in 7031 which is less fine, more granular and ~~contains~~ darker brown. Area in west of this SU was very compacted and contained very large chunks of mortar with stone - these <sup>are</sup> likely part of the southern extent of wall 7011-f1 or its destruction.
