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Description: SU 7033 contains architectural  
fill/fall from <sup>seventeenth</sup> ~~east~~ west side of the doorjamb  
7026-f1 and the east face of wall 7011-f1.  
This ~~fill~~ is arbitrarily defined by architectural  
features. In terms of ~~the~~ material it seems to  
be ~~the same as~~ <sup>similar to</sup> that excavated <sup>to the south</sup> with  
7031<sup>^</sup> but with a more granular texture and  
slightly darker brown <sup>and more compacted</sup>. It also seems  
to be ~~the~~ very similar to <sup>fill</sup> 7030 to the north of  
the doorjamb and above the <sup>Floor</sup> ~~surface~~ area level  
left by ~~the~~ excavations in northern section of  
the corridor. Su 7032 contains <sup>the</sup> same material but  
near <sup>c.</sup> 5 cm above surface. We separated the sites (7033 and 7032)  
~~of this in order to control~~ because they are  
partially separated specially by the doorjamb  
7026-f1 and because we do not know whether  
the floor will continue to be south of this feature.  
we <sup>approximate</sup> the depth of the <sup>large</sup> fill (and <sup>large</sup> rubble and  
gypsum fragments sticking vertically out of  
it) ~~like~~ su 7031 that there is likely  
a much lower surface in this corridor/room  
of annex building, perhaps at the level of  
that in ~~EU 13~~ EU 13, (7114-f1)

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Description: EU 7033 contains some

As we continued excavating the material within this SU appeared to be the same as that approx. 25 cm. North of 7026-f1, so we included this 25 x 40 cm area within SU 7033. We came down on an area of very compacted light brown sticky material with flat-lying tiles and some gypsum? These appear to be partially destroyed/damaged but they appear to extend from wall 7011-f1 to face of 7026-f1. Perhaps these elements <sup>were</sup> laid / fixed between western face of wall 7026-f1 and wall 7011-f1 in the repair phase, <sup>during</sup> of which the stones to the north of 7026-f1 may also ~~be~~ have been laid (SU 7028)
