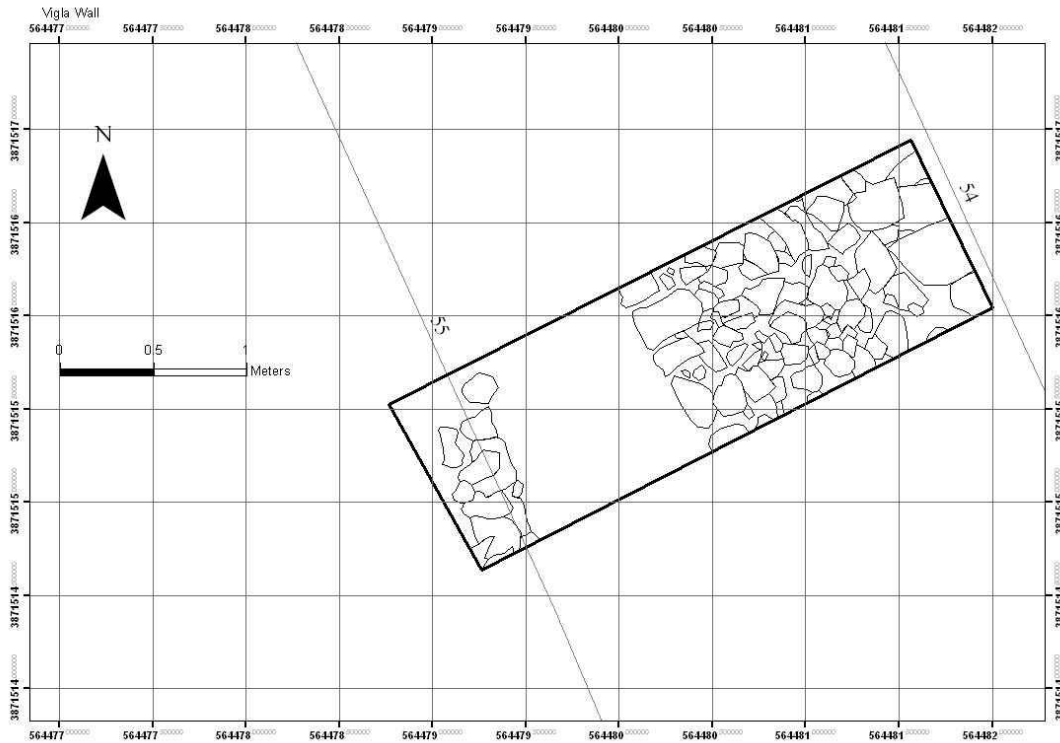


## Vigla: Excavation Unit 6

**Summary:** Excavation Unit 6 was founded with the aim of providing a foundation date for the perimeter wall, providing information related to the use and possible re-use of the structure, and definitively clarifying the wall's impressive girth and method of construction. The excavation revealed three architectural phases, all probably Hellenistic in date. The earliest phase is associated with a plaster-faced mudbrick wall running upslope, founded on bedrock. After a short abandonment of the structure associated with this mudbrick wall, a plaster-faced stone wall running along the 55 m contour line was built, associated with a packed floor of earth and gravel. Shortly thereafter, this structure appears to have been cut into by a trench associated with the construction of the fortification wall.
