summary:

**Opened:** after the traktor removed the large stone (old B.M.) when we clean the baulk we found a complete vessel in situ.

**Limits (N)** W04G0-008

(S) excavated in the past

(E) baulk

(W) baulk

**Closed:** we have reached the white layer what probably is Sloan's floor

**Matrix:** brown soil with mixture of light brown. A lot of pottery and bones. WIS samples showed some pure clay (inside the jar and attached to the wall) and other sediments around it. Above the white layer (floor) we found in the western part a surface of hard green sediment we turned to be very hard clay. One piece of BOR pottery was found.

**Relations:** This locus was found in situ in the baulk from the past. The only reason we dig it was because we saw the complete jar in situ.

The jar is standing right next to W04G0-008, from its two sides we could see white layers which may have been a floor surface (see d04G0-0010 and p04G-0015). When we checked it again it looks like Sloan's floor. The indication for it is that at the west side of the jar we could see a shards accumulation on top of these layers and it looks like the jar was broken to this direction and that the matrix above and below it had different colors. Above the shards we found two flat stones which seems to be a floor (?) which was raised after the distruction. If this is true then the jar was half way cut into the floor of the white layers. We found also two large shards above the flat stones, if they belong to the whole jar then this theory is wrong. We could not find any clear floor in the section below the jar. The two flat stones (F04G006) does not have to be a floor could be an instolation, since nothing like it was found in the same area in the past (very reasonable). Below these stones we found a bazalt graining stone (photos p04G-0016 and 0017) crushing other pottery vessels (could be another jar and a bowl). When we have finished to colect all fragments we could see that W04G-008 is later than the floor and the locus. The wall is flaoting above the level of the shards concentration and some of them are below it. Even the very end of the graining stone was under the lower level of the wall but we could take it out.

[we hardly had any place for good view of the locus since it was in the baulk and the traktor was working next to it]

**Importance:** In situ locus with a lot of interesting finds.
