Summary

Opened: Pit 18022 was opened when it was determined to be full of ZA2b material. The soil was also in drastic contrast to the rest of 18006 around it.

- Limits (N) 18006 and 18030
- (S) debris below W9278
 - (E) 18006 and 18030
 - (W) 18006 and 18030

Closed: 18022 was closed due to a lack of pottery and bone; its matrix became similar to that of 18030. Part of 18030 was combined with 18022 to make 18044. Mulbricht area below 18022 + 18030 became 18045

Matrix: Lightly packed grey to reddish brown sandy soil. A large quantity of pottery and bone was present. Large animal bone was in evidence towards the bottom of the pit. Pottery shards too grew in size until disappearing at the bottom of the pit.

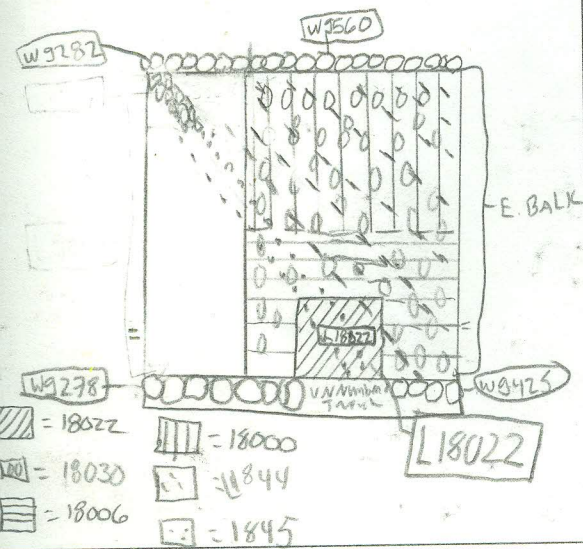
Relations: 18022 is a pit which became visible under floor 9932 and went through 18006 and 18030

- To the North 18022 cuts 18006 and 18030
- To the South 18022 reaches to the debris below W9278
- To the East 18022 cuts 18006 and 18030
- To the West 18022 cuts 18006 and 18030
- Pit 18022 began under 9932 and continues through 18006 and 18030. A large collection of pottery was excavated and was dated from IA 2b
- Pit 18022 cuts the floors/resurfacings of F18000/18006 and would have cut F18030 if F18030 had been preserved in the area of 18022
- Pit 18022 may be a continuation of Pit L9929 which was essentially in the same area and was difficult to define

Additional Observations/Value: The pit was ill-defined and may contaminate 18006 and 18030 around it and perhaps 18044 below.
