Opened: To show the western side of W18045.

Limits (N) L18045

(S) The debris below W9278

(E) L18045

(W) L9986

Closed: came down on patches of F18076 and pottery sitting on that floor. To trace floor + pottery L18081 was opened below the south portions of L9986 and 18046.

Matrix: Reddish brown soil with a small quantity of pottery sherds. A small patch of mudbrick was apparent in the south east corner but was very friable. F18030 was a series of patchy floor materials which did not extend over L18046. F18076 is becoming evident in the area beneath L18046. It has not been fully excavated.

Relations: L18046 is covered by L18030, but F18030 was too uncertain to state that it sealed 18046
 To the north L18046 reaches to L18045
 to the south L18046 continues into the debris below W9278
 To the East L18046 reaches to L18045
 To the West L18046 continues to L9986

L18046 was a small locus which was on the western side of L18045. It was a technical division and contained a small amount of data.

F18076/F9986/F18081, which is \approx to F9657 (Cheryl's Floor) is at about the same elevation as the patchy tuffite F18044. They may be of the same phase (6B)

Additional Observations/Value: The value of L18046 is in its ability to more clearly define L18045.
