

Opened: Three strones in a row suggesting a wall perpendicular to W18463. These stones functioned in installation L18470.

Limits (N) W18463
(S) L18462, L18470
(E) L18470 (plaster floor), L18400 and L18393 (both 1999).
(W) L18466, L18451

## Closed: Stones removed.

Matrix: Fieldstones $10-30 \mathrm{~cm}$ diam.
Relations: A compact reddish brown matrix (mudbrick detritis) (L18462, L18470, L18451) covered the stones of wall W18463 and the stones of W18471. Few additional stoners were in the vicinity suggesting the stones of L18471 were not part of a high wall. Two heaps of shells in L18451, the mudbrick detritis above, suggest these stones may have formed a curb within the installation, rather than a wall.

- Shells lay under the NE and S stones of wall W18471. Most likely the stones and shells were set at approximately the same time and so shells were under some stones of wall W18471 and W18463, but not others.
- This wall line likely continued to the south. Shells filled a depression conforming to the contours of a robber trench and multiple surfaces extended to the E and the W , but not the S . Ghost RT $=\mathrm{L} 18505$.

Importance: High value - only phase 11 architecture.
