**Opened:** FL9928 (Rambir's tub) found intact

**Limits (N)** W9211 and W18516

**Closed:** Floor makeup removed. Ended in homogeneous grey ashy material.

**Matrix:** White plaster (2 cm thick) covering the full below; fill consisted of red brown clayish soil (3 cm) below plaster and crushed kurkar of varying depth underneath (10-12 cm). Where plaster curved up against walls, this curve was created with thicker deposits of kurkar ( see section drawing)

**Relations:** L18495= FL9928 (1999)

The "tub"-like curving edge was evident against all 4 surrounding walls W18516-W9211, W9684, W9961, W9684.

-crushed kurkar deposit was thicker in the NE corner and in the hall of robbed stone of W18515 where FT18522 cuts W18515, but extended over the complete locus. It was clearly thicker along the edges.

The plastered surface was a pale pinkish-orange colored rather than white. The discoloration may have been caused by the heat generated by the fiery destruction evident in nearby rooms.

-L18495 is contemporary with W18516/W9211, W9961, W18481, W9684 because the edge of the tub rose against all these walls.

**Importance:** High value - Phase 9 installation, Iron Ia Pottery

- Crushed kurkar deposit was thicker in the NE corner. A best extended over the complete locus. It was clearly thicker along the edges.

The plastered surface was a pale pinkish-orange color rather than white. The discoloration may have been caused by the heat generated by the fiery destruction evident in nearby rooms.

- L18495 is contemporary with W18516/W9211, W9961, W18481, W9684 because the edge of the tub rose against all these walls.
