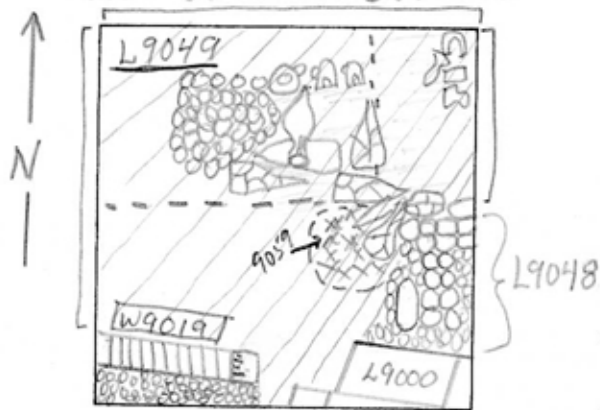

OPENED [L9049] was opened after an area of rough stones [L9048] had appeared at the bottom of [L9037] in the southeast corner of the square.

DEFINITION/LIMITS [L9049] extended southward from the north baulk around [L9048] and the area that became [L9059] to the south baulk and the scarps of earth on which [L9000] and [L9019] rest

CLOSED [L9049] was closed when a poorly preserved floor surface was found in the northwest quarter of the square. This floor was under the storage vessels found, and sherds were scattered over the uneven surface of the floor

RELATION TO OTHER ELEMENTS The soil of [L9049] reached from the north baulk southward around

the area of [L9048] to the south baulk and the scarps of earth on which [L9000] and [L9019] rest. The soil of [L9049] covered the area that came to be defined as pit [L9059] and may be related to the fill of pit [L9059].

The floor of [L9049] was made up of white material, was poorly preserved, and was uneven in surface. The floor surface extends from the west baulk eastward along the north baulk for about 2 1/2 meters. It*

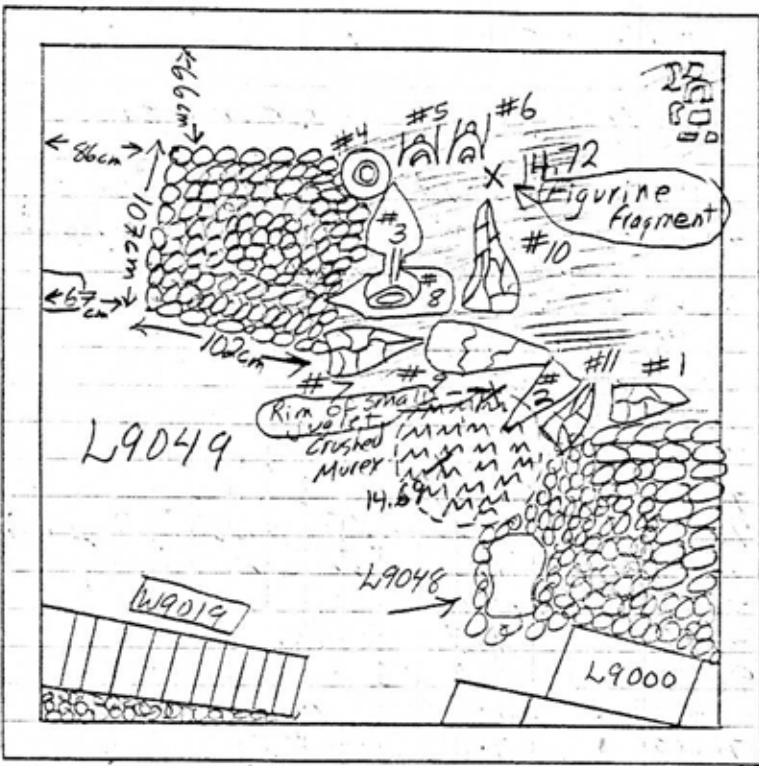

extends south from the north bank for about 2 meters. Floor [L9049] is cut in its southeast area by pit [L9059]. The crushed murex shells and broken storage vessels that made up the fill of the pit appear to have continued above the level where pit boundaries could be defined. Crushed murex shells were found in the area above [L9059] at about 15.00 m above sea level, but no pit boundary could be defined. As the excavation of [L9049] proceeded downward the area of the murex shell deposit grew larger. Murex shells were found under pots #2 and 11 which were above the level of storage jars found broken in pit [L9059]. The jars of pit [L9059] appeared to be of the same type as those found above the level of the pit and scattered over the floor surface, i.e. a partial rim and neck of an oval-mouthed amphora (as pot #3 of [L9049]), and rim and body sherds of straight-

shouldered storage jars (as pots #4, 5, & 6 of [L9049]) were found in pit [L9059].

These observations suggest that pit [L9059] and the fill of [L9049] might be related to one another and closely related in time. The pit [L9059] might have been over filled, and the entire deposit covered with fill.

As [L9048] was not excavated before the close of the 1986 season, no relationship is visible at present between [L9048] and the floor surface of [L9049]. The soil of [L9049] reached [L9048].

[MATRIX] - The soil of [L9049] was medium brown, sandy, and fairly soft. There were large numbers of sherds, at least 11, and probably more storage vessels in various states of preservation and many bones. There was a large deposit of murex shells and quite a bit of rocky rubble.
