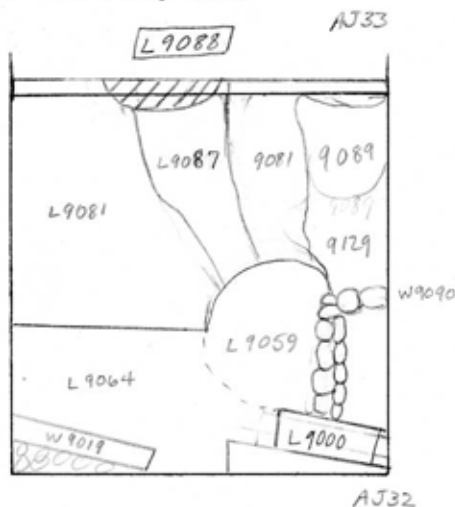

OPENED AREA of soft soil and pottery noted directly below L9079 while excavating harder soil of L9087

DEF/LIMITS L9088 WAS A PIT 110 cm from West-bank peg and extending 1.35 m to east. It is @ 40cm wide N-S. IT is limited on the south and east by L9087, on the west by L9081 B surface, which it partially overlies. Limited on the north by the excavation of L9031 and L9043 of AJ33. Upper limits uncertain as L9088 was discovered only after bank was removed.

CLOSED Material Removed. L9081 floor surface B? found below and hard soil of L9087.

RELATIONSHIPS - L9088 is directly below bank L9079. It may be continuation of Persian materials in L9049 or in AJ33 L9031, - L9043. L9088 partially cuts L9087 and cuts L9081 surface A - B - C which is very destroyed in this area. Land overlies a L9081 surface B. L9081 is series of plastered surfaces and patchings, 3 possibly 4 in number. labelled from top to bottom A-B-C, but all belong to same period. MATRIX = SOFT grey soil with heavy concentration of pottery
