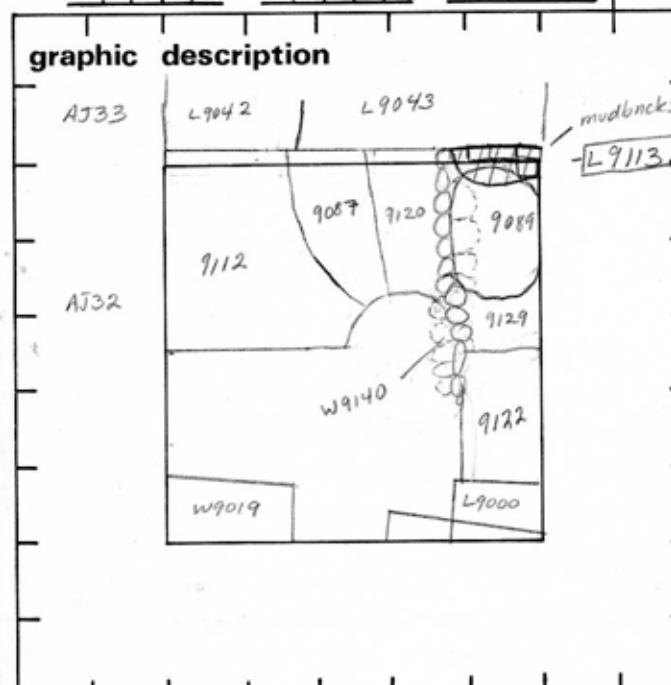

**Description:** OPENED L9113 was opened to excavate surface L9081 B east in north east corner

DEF/LIM L9113 is floor make up and material below L9081 B East. It is limited by AJ33 L9042 in north. It runs to east baulk L9089 is to the south. To the west is L9120 and more of L9089? up to western stones of W9140

Closed L9113 was closed when broken mudbricks were found along the north and eastern borders and more pit material of L9089 was encountered. This was collapsed with soil below L9089 as L9131

Relations L9113 is cut by and includes more Persian pit material of L9089. It is cut by L9043. The mudbrick material and mudbricks relate to mudbrick debris found in L9043 in SE corner. Persian contamin

**MATRIX** Broken mudbricks in dark brown mudbrick material occurred along the north and east. At level 1445 3-4 whole bricks along east baulk were found, but not in situ. This mudbrick fall was cut by shallow Persian debris, in south imbedded in <sup>hard</sup> mudbrick material. Below pit debris the matrix becomes very rocky 7/02 EBS-mixed mudbrick detritus (IA) and Persian pit (L9089)
