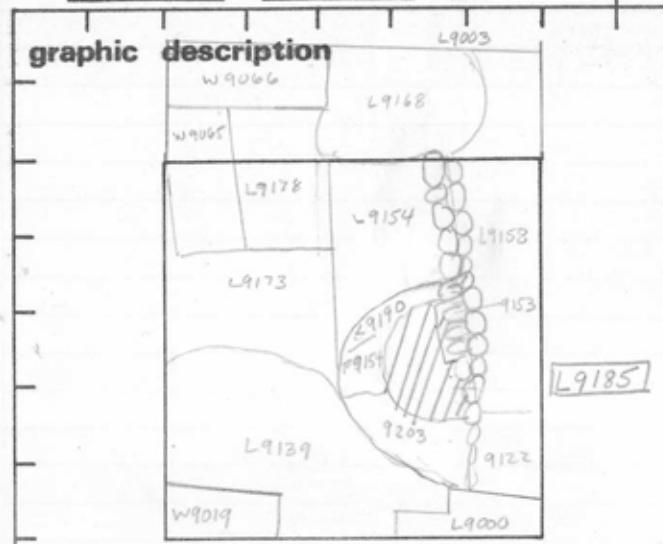

Description: OPENED L9185 was opened when an area of grey ash was noted below L9166

DEF/LIM L9185 is an ash pit, 1.05 cm EW, 1.60 cm E-W. It is limited by W9140 in the East, and L9190 in the North, South and west. L9203 below L9190 limits L9185 in the south

CLOSING Not closed at end of season

Relationships L9185 ^{Cuts!} reaches the western face of W9140. L9185 cuts L9190, F9154 and L9203. L9203 is rubble and mudbrick material, which may have been a ^{E-W} wall. L9190 which ends on F9154 slopes up as it surrounds L9185 which is cut into it. The relationship of L9185 to L9059 the

Note: Could this be an Iron Age pit below a Persian pit?

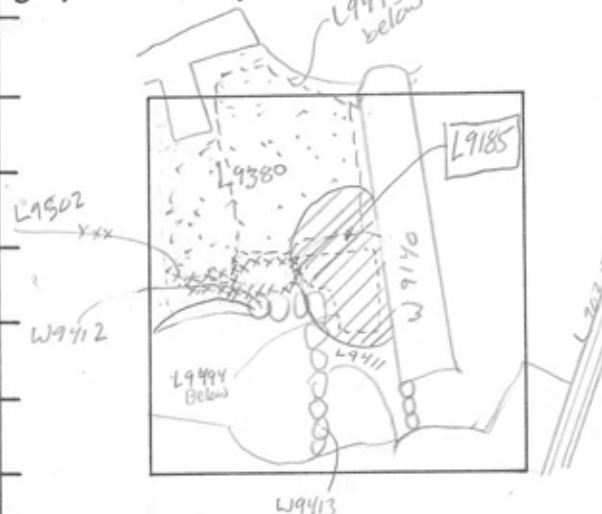

Materials of [L9380]. Pit Material Reaches W9140/ as High as was preserved As of This Season, it does not seem to cut W9140.

Previous Locus of Pit [L9185] was Pit [L9059], which had appeared to Bottom out, but was in the exact same area as [L9185]. [Pit 9059] appears to have cut [W9140] by Robbing Part of its upper course of Stones.
