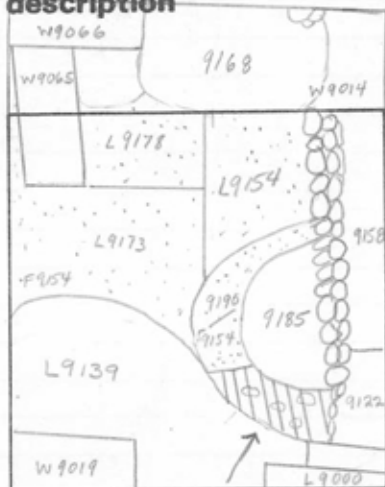

Summary:

Description:

OPENED L9203 was opened when F9154 was located below L9190 in the north and rubble and mudbrick material was found in the south becoming L9203

DEF/LIM L9203 is a strip of rubble and mudbrick material which may be the remains of a wall. L9203 is bounded by L9139 in the south and west, L9122 on the east, F9154 on the north, and L9185 on the north.

CLOSED NOT closed at end of season.

RELATIONS L9203 is cut by pit L9185 and L9139. L9203 ^{reaches?} abuts the small stones at the border of L9122 which may be a continuation of W9140. L9203 may cut

if F9154 or F9154 may reach it, if it is a wall. Mudbrick debris visible in the west bank may be associated with its continuation.

MATRIX MUDBRICK debris and rubble s/p2 CBS - same matrix noted in L9190 above.
