Summary:

Description:

Reason for opening: investigation of new locus with different color and texture soil (as distinguished from L 9170 above it). Additional purpose: removal of locus material to achieve end of season levelling in square A.I.34.

Definition / limits: L 9205 is bordered on the N by ASBANK, NW by a paving block protruding 90° from L 9085 in NE corner of A.I.34, on E by L 9085, on S by L 9198, and on W by L 9197 (robber trench).

Reason for closing: end of excavation season, subsequently to levelling of square A.I.34. Not closed.

Relation to other elements: L 9205 is cut by robber trench L 9197 and L 9198; it is cut by foundation course (or reused wall) L 9085; it is cut by foundation course (or reused wall) L 9085; it extends to ASBANK and paving stone protruding 90° from L 9085 in A.I.34. This locus (at end of season level) overlies two large paving blocks, E and NE of L 9085, set at a lower level against this locus 9085, but without conclusive evidence of a primary association with L 9085. Concrete is the binding material in L 9085, some of which overlies one block, but both blocks are plastered on flat, upper surfaces, perhaps evidence of reuse in an indeterminate manner. What is clear is that the almost block is set on line with a distinct

							<p>— Relations to other elements, continued: soil color change line running N, and north of [L9085] toward the protruding 90° set paving block, which extends at a width equal to the width of the AT34 block in question. Only further excavation can help determine more about what is apparently evidence of a robber trench running close and parallel to [L9085].</p> <p>N/Strat: Material contained throughout this locus was medium brown earth, hard packed and much strewn with rubble (field stones) running close around [L9085], [L9205] yielded a good many sherds, and yielded evidence of a robber trench (trench) at and parallel to [L9085], set on line with our almost paving block at the bottom of [L9205]. From this evidence, it remains unclear as to what precise association the two blocks maintain with L9085, as an earlier wall, or return.</p>
