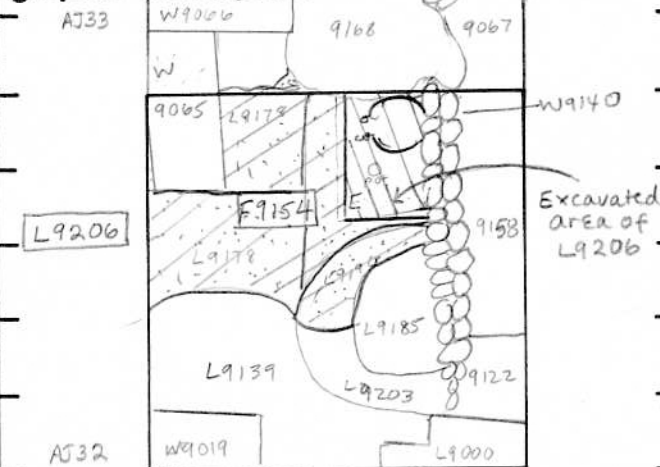

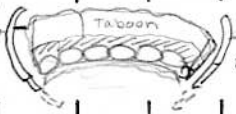
[OPENED] [L9206] was opened to excavate [F9154] and define Taboon associated with [F9154]

[DEFILIM] [L9206] is the material below F9154 originally thought to come down on another floor but no surface was located with certainty. A surface of white ash was visible in the cut of L9168 but ceased 15cm to the south. [L9206] could only be excavated as a cutting 70 cm x 1.20 cm. The excavated area is bounded by L9168 on the north, + [W9140] on the east. F9154 remains unexcavated to the west and north of [L9206]

It remains unexcavated in other areas.

[MATRIX]. Hard red-brown soil identical to [L9154] above. At northern end of trench section revealed sloping deposits of ash. These remain unexcavated. The walls of the taboon reinforced with large sherds were defined. Upper walls of the taboon were found collapsed within the taboon. Stones and pottery were also found within it, and bone. Taboon was 60 cm in diameter
