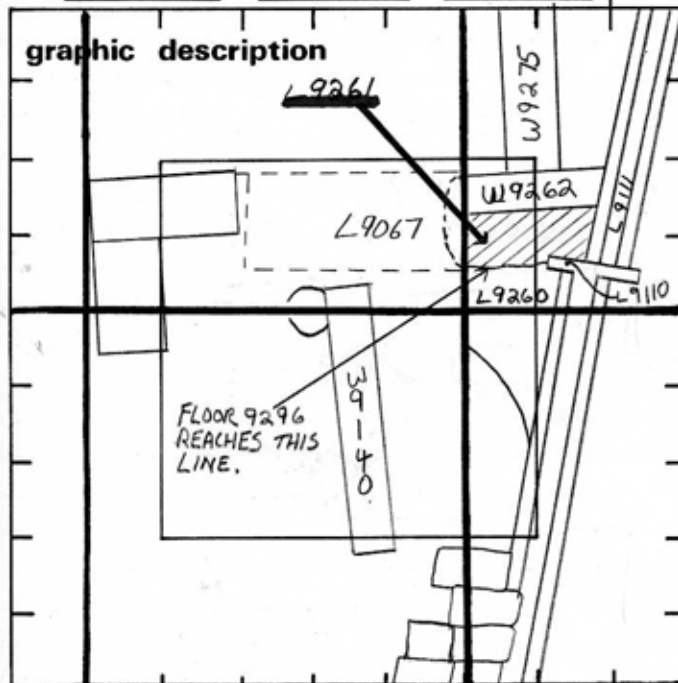

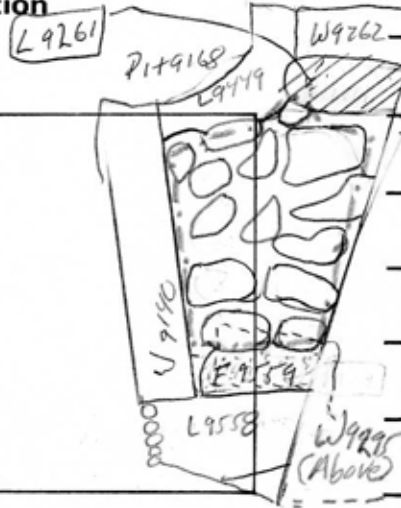
SINCE AT PRESENT W9262 IS TOO THIN (40cm) TO BE A WALL FLOOR 9296 (9296 LIES UNDER 9260 (PT) AND 9259) REACHES THE EDGE OF L9261 ON A STRAIGHT LINE, FURTHER STRENGTHENING THE HYPOTHESIS THAT L9261 IS THE FACE OF A WALL. NOTE: THE MUDBRICK MATERIAL OF L9261 AND L9262 ENTERED AJ33 IN '86 FOR 10cms. DUE TO THE SMALL AREA IT WAS NOT GIVEN A NUMBER

Description: SEE CARD 7

Relations: Floor [9261] is on the same level and Alignment as [W9295]. It lays partly on [W9300]. It may have been cut by [L9449], Mudbrick Material floating in Pit [9168]. Floor continues under [W9262], with wall sitting directly on it. It is probably the counterpart to [F9559] below [W9295].

Both [F9559] and [F9261] reach and/or cover [LW9300]; and both have mudbrick walls built at least in part on top of them ([W9295] and [W9262]).
