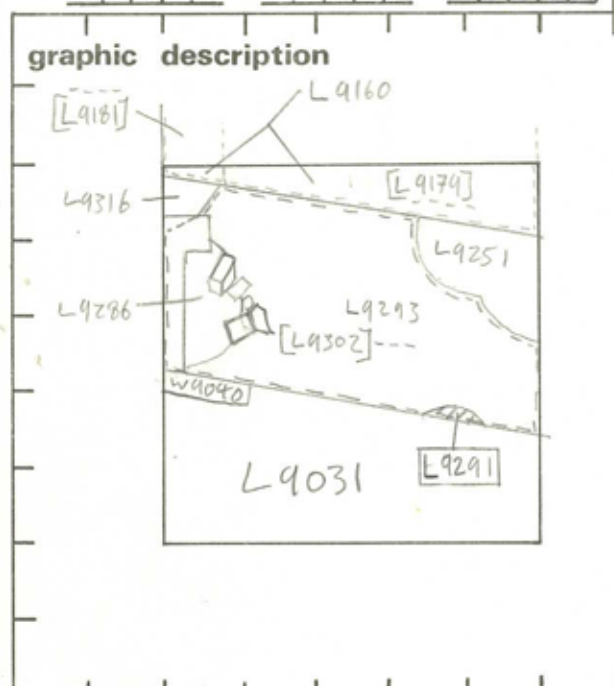

Summary:

Description: OPENED: When opening pits pass revealed a soil change in a small portion in the South of L9293.

Definition/Limits: Bounded on the Northern half by L9293 and on the South by L9031 (excavated '86 season).

matrix: grey ashy material with few sherds.

reason for closing: ashy material removed to reveal mudbrick material beneath.

relationship to other elements: L9291 is covered by L9003 and cuts L9293. L9291 covers a small portion of L9302. L9291 is probably an extension of L9031, which was excavated in '86.

JZ '84: See card L9043 for discussion of persian pit in this vicinity. L9291 is significant because it may mark the preserved top portion of the pit which was missed in '86. Might this pit be cut by the Blob?

J.S. '02: From position this appears to be the edge of pit 9168 (not missed in 87)
