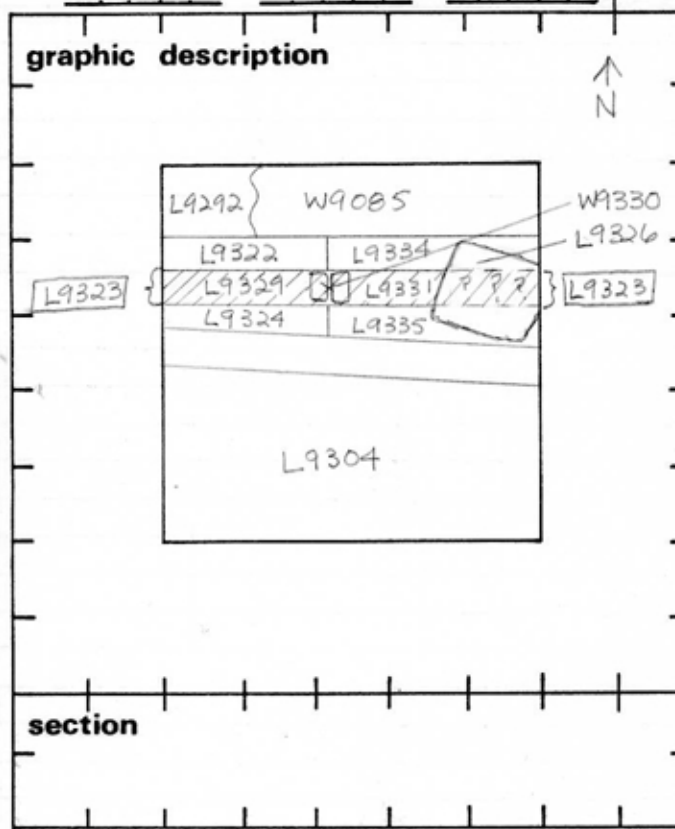

Summary:

Description: Reason for opening: Excavation revealed robber trench L9323 at the closing level of L9303.
 Definition/Limits: L9323 extends in an E-W line across the N half of Square AK34, and is bounded to the E&W by the E&W baulks. To the N, L9323 is bounded by L9322 & L9334. To the S, L9323 is bounded by L9324 & L9335.
 Reason for closing: Excavation revealed W9330 remaining in situ within robber trench L9323.
 Relation to other Elements: L9303 & the large paving stone L9326 lie immediately above L9323. L9323 cuts L9322 & L9334 to the N, & L9324 & L9335 to the S. W9330, L9329, & L9331 lie immediately below L9323. L9323 probably/possibly robbed W9330.

Matrix: L9323 consists of very dark grey soil, very fine & loosely packed, & containing numerous large pottery fragments.

NOTE: L9323 is presumed to continue under paving stone L9326 (though L9326 has not been removed) as the trench material of L9323 is apparent in the E baulk.
