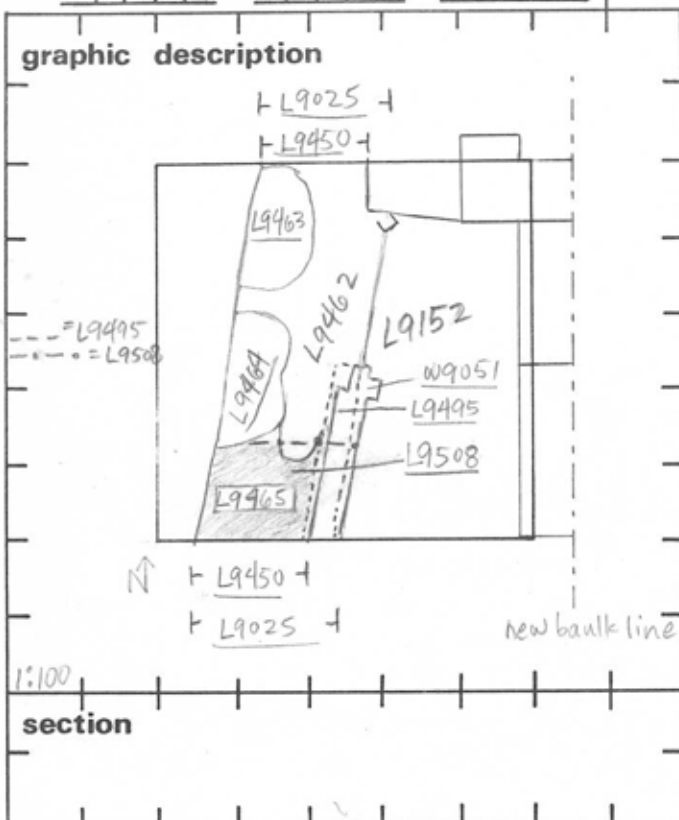

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Summary:

Description:

[Open]: In excavating fill [L9450], came down on 4 distinct, differently-colored soil, each made into a separate locus [L9462], [L9463], [L9464], and [L9465].

[Def & Limits]: To S, bounded by material below [L9025] in Square AI 31. To W, bordered by material below [L9000]. To N, bordered by [L9464] and by [L9462]. To E, bounded by [W9051].

[Matrix]: Reddish-brown soil, more densely packed than soil of pits [L9463] & [L9464] or adjacent fill area [L9462] Ca. 15 cm down, layer of head-sized cobble stones

[Closing]: Pit [L9464] continued to grow toward S & SE thus undercutting [L9465]. Also, came down on material like that of [L9465] in S half of [L9495], so closed both [L9465] & [L9495].

[Relations] The S half of [L9495] may contain the same material as that of [L9465]. [L9465] reaches the

material below drain [L9025] in Sq. AI 31. [L9465] lies below [L9000] and [L9450] [L9465] is probably cut by pit [L9464] and probably cuts [L9462]. It was difficult to define the limits of pit [L9463] (and [L9464]) because pit bowed out  $\approx 5$  at bottom. Hence <sup>precise</sup> boundaries of pit [L9464] not visible from above.
