Summary

Opened: Came down upon 1989 locus levels after soil-wash of [L9601] above was removed. Two distinct areas were revealed, [L9612] (mudbrick debris) & L9629 (cobble stones).

Limits (N) Bounded by N bank of AI32

(S) Bordered by L9152 and material within 1987 E bank trimmed back .5 m in 1989

(E) Bounded by 1989 E bank of AI32

(W) Bounded by [L9612]

Closed: Came down upon probable end of suspected robber trench ([L9612] & [L9629]); materials now the same

Matrix: Fist- to head-sized cobble stones floating in mudbrick debris, ^{50%} more common than material to W in [L9612]; eastern section of [L9629] adjacent to the E bank of AI32 composed of mudbrick debris only; little pottery & few bones found throughout

Relations: [L9612] reaches [L9629] to W; these two loci may be part of a robber trench used to rob stones of an E-W wall that intersected [W9051] at the NW end of AI32. The situation of the single stone sticking out perpendicular from W9051 suggests the existence of a robber trench, although we did not observe any other physical evidence. To the N, [L9629] reaches the material at the bank line between AI32 and AI33, but since AI33 has not yet been excavated here, we cannot yet determine their relation. To the E, [L9629] reaches the E bank of AI32. To the S, [L9629] is in fact a robber trench, cut [L9152]. It also reaches the material within the original (1987) E bank of AI32. The E bank was trimmed back .5 m in 1989 without being excavated stratigraphically, due to heavy erosion. Therefore, there are no other loci that relate to [L9629] to the E.

Additional Observations/Value: Since the cobble stones in [L9629] did not seem to form an architectural unit, the RT hypothesis is probable.
