**Opened:** L9631 came down on a layer of cobbles. L9643 was opened to determine whether this layer extended eastward.

**Limits (N)** Bounded by L9651, A.I.24 - no loci were set in this line  
**(S)** Bounded by W9278 (end fill below)?  
**(E)** Bounded by L9298  
**(W)** Bounded by L9111 and L9631

**Closed:** Come down to continuation of cobbles at base of L9631 and wall; subdivided into L9667 and W9684

**Matrix:** loose, med. grey soil. Probably mostly wash from previous years. L9297 above is a mixed fill and L9643 is probably similar to this (card for L9297 is ambiguous)

**Relations:** L9643 is a continuation of L9297 above. L9643 is cut by W9278 to the S. L9643 is cut by the drain L9111. L9643 reaches L9631 (a sealed Iron Age fill). L9643 is probably cut by L9651, a Persian pit to the N. L9643 covers, and is a continuation of 9667 below. It also covers W9684
