Summary

Opened: When cleaning locus [L9603] was removed and fallen mudbrick material of [L9668] and grey ash material of [L9669] were uncovered.

Limits (N) Bounded on the North by [L9662] and [L9655].

(S) Bounded on the South by the southern edge of AK33.

(E) Bounded on the East by the eastern edge of AK33.

(W) Bounded on the West by [L9669].

Closed: Collapsed with [L9662], material below [L9663], [L9669], and [L9655], all of similar fallen mudbrick material matrix, to form super locus [L9679].

Matrix: Many fallen field stones (10-50cm) in fallen mudbrick material with disassociated reed mat material, bits of Kurkar and plaster throughout, and some pottery and bone.

Relations: [L9668] is covered by cleaning locus [L9603], to which it has no stratigraphical relationship. [L9668] covers a portion of [L9679], which is the continuation of the material of [L9668]. [L9668] is cut by pits [L9655] and [L9669]. [L9668] is the continuation of the material of [L9662] to the South of [L9662]. [L9668] and [L9662] were separated for technical reasons and were later collapsed together into [L9679]. [L9668] is also probably the continuation of [L9302] in SQ AK33, excavated in the '88 season, which was of a similar matrix. The same applies to [L9459] in SQ AK32, excavated in the '89 season. In reference to the above mentioned technical separation and subsequent collapse of [L9662] and [L9668], this was the result of [L9668] being covered by cleaning locus [L9603] and of [L9662] being covered by [L9644] and [L9645], which required their being excavated as separate loci until such time that it could be ascertained that they were truly of a similar matrix.

Additional Observations/Value: Fallen mudbrick material cut by Persian pits.
Little value.
