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Summary

Opened: In excavating [L9703] and [F9703], came down on floor; opened [L9727] as floor makeup of [F9703] and fill below

Limits (N) Bounded by [W9704]

(S) Bounded by S bank of A132

(E) Bounded by E bank of A132

(W) Bordered by [L9539] and [L9558]

Closed: Came down on [F9727]; pit [L9736], and destruction layer [L9737] were opened

Matrix: Floor makeup of [F9703] consisted of thin, patchy, white plaster material; fill consisted of mudbrick debris, charcoal, ash, abundant (but less than from above) pottery & bones; the most significant find was a complete fish found on top the floor (ca. 3-4 cm)

Relations: [L9703] and [F9703] lie above [L9727]; [F9703] does not seal [F9727], however, due to its fragmentary nature; [F9703] was seen primarily in the S and W parts of the locus, and appears to reach [W9704]. [L9727] and [F9727] cover, but do not seal, [L9736]. [L9736] is dug from [L9727]. It appears that the kurkar surface of [F9727] was laid down after [L9736] was dug, due to the way the edges of the floor form a lip, curling under, around the edges of the pit, particularly at the E and W. [F9727] is well-preserved ^{only} in the E and W parts of the locus; therefore due to its fragmentary nature, [F9727] does not seal all the material below [L9727]. [F9727] does seal, however, [L9737], a layer of burnt mudbricks. [F9727] appears to underlie [W9704]. The fill of [L9727] and [L9703] reach [W9704]. In some places, [F9727] definitely lies below [F9703], in other places, the two floors (though of different materials) appear to be a surface and re-surfacing, implying a single floor. If this were the case, the observation of [F9703] reaching [W9704] and [F9727] underlying [W9704] is contradictory. To the S, [F9727] and [L9727] reach the S bank of A132. To the E, [F9727] and [L9727] reach the E bank of A132. To the W, the relation between [L9558] and [L9727] is uncertain, but they may be identical fill. [L9539] probably cuts [L9727] and [F9727].

Additional Observations/Value: Due to the fragmentary nature of [F9727], some material below may be disturbed. Medium value.

1992 Note: Pit [L9702] at SE corner of [L9756] (= [L9727]), was not observed in 1991; therefore [L9727] may be contaminated. See 1992 locus card for [L9762], [F9727] and [F9703] above may underlie [W9704] as [F9559] underlies [W9295].

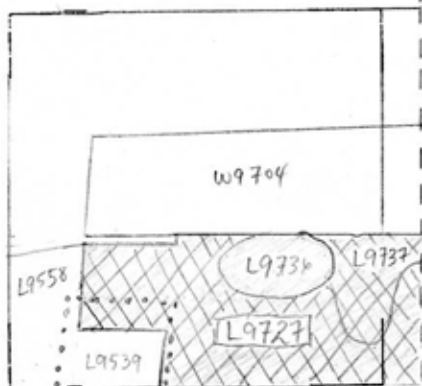
