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Summary

Opened: Came down on [F9770] in East part of [L9770], mudbrick debris to West, and heavier mudbrick material in center at [W9728]; opened [L9775] East of wall, [L9776] West of wall

Limits (N) Bounded by [L9095] and material below and by [L9732]

(S) Bounded by [L9673]

(E) Bounded by material in East bank of AI32 and AI33

(W) Bounded by [W9728]

Closed: Came down on [F9775]; opened [L9787] as floor makeup and fill below

Matrix: Crumbly grey-brown mudbrick debris down to thin white, crushed kurkar surface, very fragmentary; [F9775] preserved mainly at South East part of locus; very little pottery or bones; matrix of fill very likely collapse of [W9728] to the West

Relations: [L9770] and [F9770] cover, but do not seal, [L9775], due to the fragmentary nature of [F9770]. [L9775] and [F9775] cover, but do not seal, [L9787], due to the fragmentary nature of [F9775].

To the North, the fill of [L9775] continues into the material below [L9095]. The fill of [L9775] continues into [L9732], and is probably identical to it. No floor, however, was observed in [L9732]. The relation of [F9775] is uncertain since it is so fragmentary and not well preserved, if at all, at the North.

To the South, the fill of [L9775] seems to continue into [L9673] and may be identical to it. [F9673], at 14.51 (E) to 14.48 (W), may be identical to [F9775].

To the East, [L9775] and [F9775] continue into the East bank of AI32 and AI33

To the West, the fill of [L9775] reaches [W9728]. The relation of [F9775] to [W9728] is uncertain since [F9775] is not well preserved at the West. The relation of [F9673] to the West is likewise uncertain "because of its fragmentary nature and the presence of mud-brick material in the Western part of the locus which may interrupt the floor."

Additional Observations/Value: Since unsealed and fragmentary [F9775] only of medium value.
