Opened: Rubble locus 9667 became [9777] when it came down on a layer of compacted mudbrick debris.

Matrix: Dark brown, very compact mudbrick debris. Almost no pottery was recovered. Similar to 9694. DARKER & HARDER THAN SLIGHTLY LIGHTER COLORED 9754 TO NORTH

Relations: [9777] is covered by 9667 in the center and by 9683 at its eastern and western extremes. [9777] is a continuation below 9683 of 9683. [9777] reaches W 9684 to the east. [9777] is cut by the Persian pit 9680 to the west. 9754 reaches the northern face of [9777] and possibly cuts it. [9777] continues to the south as 9694 and 9309. 9681 covers the W. extreme of [9777] and probably cuts it.

Additional Observations/Value: Iron Age mudbrick debris locus. Of little stratigraphic value
