BELOW: EAST END OF L9798 COVERS WEST PART OF FLOOR L9754 WHILE WEST PART OF L9798 CUTS THIS FLOOR (C) THE DIFFERENCE WHICH MUST HAVE EXISTED BETWEEN THE MATRIX COVERING THE FLOOR AND THE MATRIX CUTTING THE FLOOR WAS NOT OBSERVED. NORTH: MATRIX OF L9798 CONTINUES INTO NORTH BAULK. WEST: GRAY ASH OVERLYING RUBBLE WHICH CONSTITUTED MATRIX AT WEST PART OF LOCUS CONTINUES INTO BAULK BENEATH WALL W9774. (C) WEST OF FLOOR L9754 MATRIX OF L9798 CONTINUES DOWN INTO L9837

(+) FROM INTER-FLOOR MATRICES L9793 & L9818. AT EAST END OF L9798 A DEPOSIT OF RUBBLE STONES WAS REVEALED. THESE SEEMED TO PARTLY OVERLIE THE NW. PART OF FLOOR L9754 AND PERHAPS CONTINUE INTO PIT L9785/L9833. A THICK LAYER OF GRAY ASH OVERLYING STONE RUBBLE (?) WAS FOUND AT W. PART OF LOCUS.

**Additional Observations/Value:** THE STRAIGHT NATURE OF THE WEST END OF FLOOR L9754 MAY INDICATE A LATE IRON AGE ROBBING ACTION. INCLUSION OF LATE IRON C SHERDS IN MATRIX OF L9798 INDICATE IT MAY BE 7TH C. MAT
