Opened: L9759 came down on mudbricks and surrounding debris - mudbricks became L9827 and surrounding area became L9817.

Limits (N) L9817

(S) W9729

(E) W9845

(W) L9817

Closed: Reached level of floor 9817 to the W. - End of season - Not closed

Matrix: One and possibly two courses of a mudbrick floor or installation. See L9759 card for description of surface. In the SE corner, there was looser, sandy grey soil which also formed a boundary between the mudbricks and W9845. Very little pottery. Complete iron axe/adze head and bowl base.

Relations: appear to be sitting on a phantom floor. A small area light grey sandy soil (much lighter in color than grey soil above) was noted in SE corner. This may be a part of the floor. Floor level is the same as that for floor 9817 to the W. The mudbricks appear to continue below the base level of L9827.

RELATIONS: L9759 covers but does not seal L9827. L9827 is not a continuation of L9759. L9817 reaches the N. and W. faces of L9827. L9827 appears to reach the N. face of W9729 - the mudbricks appear to be abutted against this face. The relationship between L9827 and W9845 is uncertain.

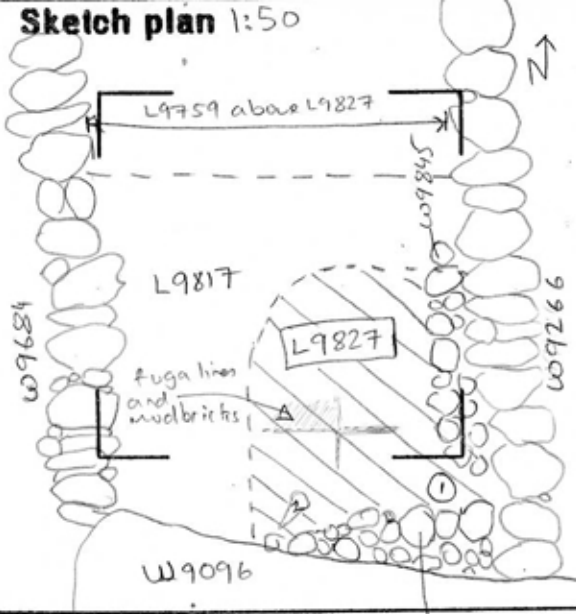
Upper phase of bricks drawn, but not lower phase.
