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Summary

Opened: IN ORDER TO DETERMINE IF THE PILE OF RUBBLE L9865 WAS A WALL.

Limits (N) L9856 (A CLEANING LOCUS), L9657
 (S) L9856, L9657.

Closed: WHEN THE TOP FEW STONES WERE FOUND TO BE FLOATING ABOVE A TABUN AND A LARGE CACHE OF POTTERY, AND STONES WERE REMOVED.

Matrix: DOUBLE TO TRIPLE HEAD-SIZED STONES. INTERMIXED WITH A NUMBER OF POT SHEPDS AND APPROX. 1 DOZEN FIST-SIZE STONES.

Relations: [L9865] A PROBABLE TUMBLE FROM A WALL, BOTH COVERS AND SEALS [L9880] A TABUN. IT IS REACHED FROM THE NORTH SOUTH AND EAST BY CLEANING LOCUS [L9856] BY FLOOR DEPOSIT [L9657], AND FILL BELOW FLOOR MAKEUP [L9630]. IT IS COVERED BUT NOT SEALED BY [L9657] AND [L9630]. IT CANNOT BE DETERMINED AT WHAT POINT [L9865] BEGINS IN THE INTERFACE BETWEEN [L9657] AND [L9630]. EITHER THE TUMBLE WAS BELIEVED TO BE ONLY A FEW STONES AND SO UNIMPORTANT, OR NOT SEEN AT ALL IN [L9630]. - IT WAS NOT MENTIONED IN THE RELATIONS OF L9630 IN 1991 CARD. [L9865] COVERS [F9657] TO THE EAST OF [L9880]. ONLY THE TOP TIER OF STONES IN [L9865] REACH [W9266]. IT IS DOUBTFUL THAT THE TUMBLE WAS ORIGINALLY FROM [W9266] ALTHOUGH THE MATRIX IS SIMILAR. NO OTHER TUMBLE WAS DISCOVERED ALONG THE LENGTH OF [W9266] COVERING [F9657]. IT IS POSSIBLE THAT [W9266] FEW ONLY IN THE SOUTHERN SECTION OF AH33 WHILE THE REMAINDER OF THE WALL REMAINED INTACT. IT IS MORE PROBABLE THAT THE TUMBLE ORIGINATED FROM AN AS YET UNKNOWN FEATURE. ANOTHER POSSIBILITY IS THAT THE TABUN IN [L9880] WAS USED AS A FOUNDATION FOR A STAIRWAY OR OTHER FEATURE RATHER THAN A LOCALISED FALL. THE LACK OF TOTAL DESTRUCTION OF THE TABUN'S POTTERY WOULD SUPPORT THIS. WHEN THE TABUN OF [L9880] WAS OUT OF SERVICE AND USED AS A FOUNDATION, THE TABUN OF [L9658] COULD THEN HAVE BEEN BUILT.

Additional Observations/Value: HIGH VALUE - L9865 SEALS A TABUN L9880. ALL POTTERY FROM L9865 HAS BEEN SENT FOR RESTORATION WITH THAT IN L9657 FROM 1991 SEASON AND L9880. ADDITIONAL PHOTOS = 1001741
