Summary _____

Opened: To see if easterly sloping mudbrick material of L 9884 continues to the east

Limits (N) Bounded on the N by the bank
 (S) Bounded on the S by the bank
 (E) Bounded on the E by L 9884
 (W) Bounded on the W by material under L 9917

Closed: Came down on a wall in the S part

Matrix: In the S red-brown sandy material with pottery, bones and some shells. Here and there patches of grey ash in the N of L 9867 same material but general colour more greyish. L 9884 contains more mudbrick. L 9857 was more greyish. Loc L 9916 and L 9918 more or less same material as L 9867.

Relations: L 9857 covers, but does not seal L 9867. L 9867 covers, but does not seal L 9916, L 9917 and L 9918.
 To the west L 9917 floats above L 9867
 To the east L 9867 may reach L 9884, which contains more mudbrick material.
 To the north L 9867 appears to continue into the bank
 To the south L 9867 appears to continue into the bank

Comment: 2 different pottery baskets were used for the north and south part of the locus, because of the difference in soil colour. But it appears to be one and the same fill material and there is no difference between the pottery from both sides (all iron I / II A)

Additional Observations/Value: Fill material, without any architecture, no specific value
