Summary

Opened: To expose E. face of W9140 in the area between Persian pits L9251 and L9168.

Limits (N) Persian pit L9251
 (S) Persian pit L9168
 (E) L9836
 (W) W9140

Closed: When came down on possible mudbrick partition wall W9886 and ghost floor F9873 to N of W9886.

Matrix: Dense compact mudbrick debris of various colors (grey, chocolate brown, "old teeth" colored tuffaceous) with areas of loose brown loam. One complete storage jar sitting on ghost floor. Several fist size and double fist size cobbles in section, it appears as though mudbricks have fallen, similar L9836. Though this has

Relations: also been interpreted as a wall (W9886). Similar to matrix in L9332 above and L9836 to the E.

RELATIONS: [L9873] is a continuation below of the mudbrick debris locus L9332.

To the N. L9251 a Persian pit, cuts [L9873].

To the S. L9168, another Persian pit, also cuts [L9873].

To the W. [L9873] reaches the E. face of W9140.

To the E. [L9873] appears to continue into L9836, another mudbrick debris locus, which came down on F9836.

Below, [L9873] covers but does not seal W9886. See card for W9886, which is a questionable wall at best.

The ghost floor [F9873] is probably at 13.41 (this elevation was taken at the base of the complete vessel. This floor would probably be a continuation of F9836 to the E (at 13.34).

This locus contains a restorable storage jar.

Additional Observations/Value: Essentially a twilight zone between two Persian pits; very low value.
