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Opened: L9857 was split into L9878 [L9879] and W9887 when it came down on F9857 and W9887. [L9879] is area N. of W9887.

Limits (N) W9262
(S) W9887
(E) W9728
(W) Eroded area below L9449

Closed: Came down on [F9879] and W9888.

Matrix: Dense, ashy matrix mixed with mudbrick debris. The floor is a smooth and complete turtlar and ash floor. The floor is much more uniform than the patchy, undulating floor F9878 to the S. Essentially the same, though more complete, than F9930 to the S. To the E, the floor continues as mudbricks.

Relations: Above the N. extension of L9857 (where there is no floor) covers but does not seal [L9879].

To the N. [L9879] is cut by the S. face of the socle for W9262.
 To the S. [L9879] reaches the N. face of W9887.
 To the E. [L9879] is probably cut by the W. face of the socle for W9728.
 To the W. [L9879] erodes into the wash to the N. of L9300 and below L9449, and does not appear contemporary to the pavement L9300.*
 To the E. [F9879] continues as two or three mudbricks set up against (or probably cut by) W9728. To the S. [F9879] continues below W9887 and is actually a N. continuation of F9930 which both make a single floor. W9887 is built upon the junction of these two floors (at the technical division). [F9879] is cut by the socle of W9262 to the N.

Along with W9887 and F9930, [F9879] seals an area of F9953 below. [F9879] may continue below: A. socle of W9728, though confirmation of this will depend on removal of the wall. It may be F9813 or F9834 E of W9728.

* The erosion of L9449 has destroyed any connection which may have existed between F9879 and L9300
