Summary

**Opened:** To take down eastern bank [L9893] in which [L9892] ran clearly from east to west

**Limits (N)** Bounded on the N by [L9893]

**(S)** Bounded on the S by [L9891]

**(E)** Bounded on the E by the W. limit of square AY 32

**(W)** Bounded on the W by [L9884]

**Closed:** Came down on a layer of shells supporting the mudbrick. Under shells same material as rest of bank

**Matrix:** Mudbrick debris with lots of shells at the bottom. Easily distinguishable from material of [L9893] and [L9884] which is <sup>more</sup> greyish with only fragments of mudbrick material. The material of [L9891] is the fill of pit. Greyish with lots of pottery sherds and no traces of mudbrick material

**Relations:** [L9892] continues [L9557] from above. [L9892] covers, but does not seal [L9893].

To the south the pit [L9891] probably cuts [L9892]

To the north [L9892] cuts [L9893] and [L9893] also appears to continue under [L9892]

To the west [L9892] reaches [L9884]. [L9892] would have cut [L9884] if it had continued since [L9884] appears to continue into [L9893].

To the east [L9892] doesn't appear to continue into square AY 32. There is no mention of mudbrick wall or debris on the west side of AY 32 around this level. Only a fill of red clayish soil [L9173], that might be mudbrick debris, is mentioned (d. 13.94 to 13.70)

3/02 EB-S based on elevations, this is W9557 which deteriorated from 1989-92. Persian pots so mixed locus.

**Additional Observations/Value:** Mudbrick debris or wall with no evident connection to any architectural feature
