Opened: Took out pavement of L9942

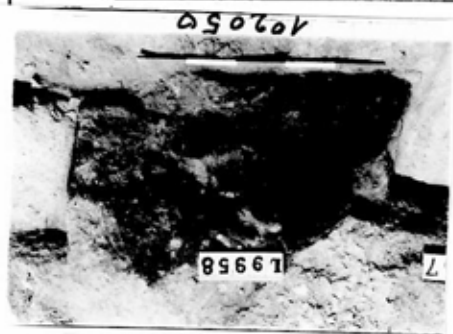
Limits (N) L 9987 and L 9931
 (S) L 9891 and L 9977
 (E) Western limit of square 1732
 (W) L 9918, L 9925, L 9924 and L 9935
 Closed: End of season, and came down on 2-3 cm layer of ash over most of area of L9958

Matrix: under pavement first brown, sandy material with small stones, smashed pottery (pithos) and on the bottom a thick sloping ash layer. Small fragments of floor (very thin and white) on the highest part of the locus (E). L 9987 brown sandy material L 9991 pit material: brown sandy with a lot of pottery and bone L 9977 brown sandy material

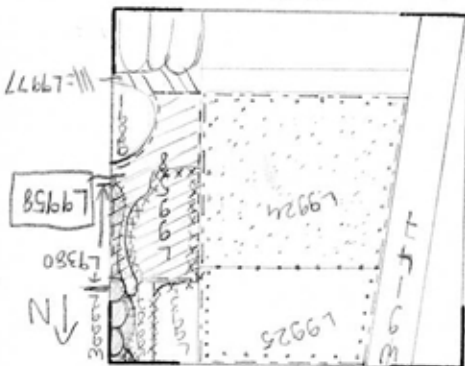
Relations: Continuation of matrix: L 9918 greyish in the N and red-brown in the S L 9920 and L 9925 red-brown L 9925 greyish material
 Relations: L 9942 seals L 9958, L 9958 covers but does not seal L 9995*
To the N L 9958 continues into L 9987 since the floor fragments of L 9958 extend into L 9987, L 9931 might reach the ash layer of L 9958 and L 9958 above it
To the S L 9958 is cut by the pit L 9891 and probably continues into the fill material of L 9991
To the W L 9958 may be reached by L 9918, L 9925, L 9924 and L 9925
but this relation is not certain
To the E L 9380 of square 1732 might be a continuation of L 9958 (cl. 13.80-13.33)
The locus consists of layers of brown sandy soil, ashy soil and charcoal and plaster floors. The elev of the floor is 13.51-13.60 it might be a continuation of Floor L 9958 where more residues were visible. This is also the case for the fragmentary floors of L 9380
* because the L 9958 was narrow and sinuous. The ash material at the bottom of L 9991 (where L 9958 is not preserved) covers and likely seals the unexcavated and unnumbered locus below. The ash layer at the bottom of L 9958 extends into L 9931, L 9987 and L 9995. In about the center of L 9958 was a lense of pithos body sherds which looked in situ; this is odd since no rim, handle or base was evident
L 9958 only reaches W 9992. It is not clear what cut L 9958 to the W. To the S it is cut by pit L 9891. To the E it may
