Summary

Opened: When L9903 came down on surface F9903, unnumbered and unexcavated mudbricks in Eo 2/3 of locus and two mudbricks in SW corner of locus reaching W9211.

- Limits (N)** Bounded on the North by L9985
(S) Bounded on the South by W9211
(E) Bounded on the East by L9985
(W) Bounded on the West by unexcavated material below W9408.

Closed: Not closed, end of season

Matrix: Two brown mudbricks, one 35 x 20cm, the other 25 x 25cm.

Relations: L9903 covers the eastern portion of this mudbrick bench locus, the unexcavated material below W9408. covers the rest. Locus 9974 was found during building for L9903 below W9408. Shortly thereafter F9903 was uncovered around L9974 to the NE. Area split into L9974 and L9985. L9974 is layed on stones which have yet to become a wall but may, thus the difference in levels between L9974 and L9985. L9974 abuts W9211 and also appears to continue into the unexcavated material below W9408. B99439, a painted juglet, relating to the possible cultic assemblage on surface F9903, was found on L9974 within L9903.

Additional Observations/Value: Mudbrick bench relating to possible cultic assemblage of Iron I pottery abutting Iron Age wall. High Value.
